Finals - Extra Time & Time off for Injury

In any <u>Semi Final or Final</u> match in <u>First or Reserve Grade</u> if the score be equal at full time a further ten minutes each way will be played. If after this period the scores are still equal the team which occupied the higher position in the Competition at the conclusion of the Competition shall be deemed to have won the match.

In any <u>Grand Final</u> match in <u>First and Reserve Grades</u>, if the scores be equal at full time an extra period of **ten minutes each way** without an interval will be played, should the score remain equal, then, after a five minute interval, an additional <u>five minutes each way</u> shall be played, during which time the <u>first scorer wins</u>. If after this period the scores are still equal, the participating teams shall be declared joint premiers.

In <u>Under 19s and Under 17s and any other age group</u> in the event of scores being equal at full time in <u>Semi Finals</u>, <u>Finals and Grand Finals</u> no <u>additional time</u> may be played where the duration of the game in total would exceed seventy (70) minutes.

In the Under 19s and Under 17s and any other age group where the two sides draw a match in the Semi Finals and Finals the side higher at the completion of the Competition rounds shall be declared the winner.

In the case of the Grand Final for the Under 19s and Under 17s and any other age group if two sides draw at the completion of the game they shall be declared **Joint Premiers.**

For all Semi-Finals, Finals and Grand Finals time-off for injury, will be taken for all Grades.

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
